CBRPA COMPUTER PROBLEMS

CBRPA appreciates the patience and understanding of the RPAs during the month of November when the main computer was stricken with an encryption virus. This was no ordinary computer virus — it placed an encryption code on every file on the computer and even on the files on the external hard drive. Efforts were made by several programs and security agencies to break the encryption code—to no avail. A ransom of \$500.00 had to be paid in bit coins and then the bit coin agency charged another \$130.00 to process the ransom.

Several companies and public service agencies have suffered the same fate and all had to pay the ransom. According to the FBI, there is no encryption key yet developed to break the code. The source of the code is in eastern Europe or in Russia.

If you should get an email stating a federal express package was delivered but no one was available to sign for it and to "click here" to reschedule"—do NOT click, delete it immediately. Also do not click on any pop-ups—that



is the lesson learned the hard way. Again, thank you for your understanding.
